## A MAJOR CONGERN

Q: Which provinces are of the most concern for safety and protection of commuters?
A: We have focused our attention on the major cities such as NCR, DAGUPAN, SAN FERNANDO, LAGUNA, CAVITE, CEBU AND DAVAO since these are the places where population concentration is great and commuters are increasing exponentially.

Q: Speaking of commuters - what means of transportation are covered?
A: Our program covers land, sea, air and rail transport.

Q: Does the Center possess police / legislative powers?
A: No police / legislative powers because the Center is mainly for research and policy recommendation. But we do have the program called LIGTAS PATROL which is our Mass Organization tasked to be the "eyes" of government agencies involved in commuter activities.

Q: Please explain the major duties of Ligtas Patrol.
A: Ligtas Patrol is a monitoring group which reports anomalies to the proper government agencies. It's members are commuters .-students, yuppies, even drivers.

Q: Is this a volunteer group?
A: Yes, it is a volunteer group. In cooperation with the Red Cross, we have trained at least 2,000 members to become certified First Responders.

Q: How can one be a member of Ligtas Patrol? A: Simply log on to facebook/ligtaspatrol.

A country's development runs
on wheels. Commuter rights, safety, and protection are important concerns of the public. Byahe Na! interviewed the President of the National Center for Commuter Safety \& Protection, Mrs. Elvira Y. Medina, on her office's programs and policies. The Ligtas Patrol Program was also discussed.

Q: What are the top 3 causes of car accidents and what are your top 3 plans to reduce car accidents? A: Based on research by WHO, 60\% of accidents are caused by human factor (Driver). The $40 \%$ are due to either the condition of the vehicles and/ or condition of the roads or other factors. Since 2010, we have been conducting sessions for drivers entitled, "DRIVE FOR LIFE". It is mainly to address proper behaviour and management of road rage, coupled with a First Responders' training by Red Cross. JAM was one of our first clients. To this date, we have trained almost 7,000 drivers and conductors on "DRIVE FOR LIFE" and 2,000 for Red Cross.

Q: On a personal note, we heard that you have a wide range of interests and skills like marketing, press and PR relations, networks in tourism and hospitality, HR training... even launching ballroom dancing events! How do you relax after a day's work of traffic, road rage and other challenges?
A: I swim and do creative writing
Q: As a closing remark, what is your message to the commuting public - traffic victims, or driving public - tra
violators?
A: Life is precious. It's the only valuable thing in the world that cannot be restored nor replaced. Drive as if the Lord is at your back seat --- then, you will be safe.

Bob's at B. S. Aquino Drive-from the time our parents were teens to now, when my own children are teens, Bob's is iconic in the history and celebrations of Bacolod. It has witnessed thousands of family feasts bringing joy and fond memories! We always come back for the Buffet, Cheesy Potato a hit amo kids, Sizzling Steaks, Bob's Magnifique Sandwich, Pancit Luglug and Chicken Mandarin Salad. The current menu has much more to offer. And keep a copy of the placemat too - it shows the menu of 1965 , when BOB's was established.
Roli's at La Salle Avenue and Lopue's East - another oldie favorite for their famous Chicken Sandwich. I also enjoy their Bijon Malabon and Pancit Molo. The origina restaurant was in the downtown area, Plaza Mart San Juan Street. Roli's is where we can take out Napoleones, the popular puff pastry glazed and filled with a creamy filling.
Pepe's at Hi-Strip 4, Circumferential Road - Pepe's first opened at Piazza Sorrento at Lacson Street and it's where Yuppies hang out, even on weeknights. You would usually bump into somebody you know at Pepe's. The best sellers are Pesto Chicken, Lamb Stew, Beef Salpicao, their version of Green Salad and their wide array of cocktail drinks. No worries, your kids can come with you at Pepe's, it's a place where families can wine and dine together.

## 21 Restaurant at 21st Lacson Street -started in a

Inaka at 21st Lacson Street - This is the Japanese Restaurant and like Bob's and 21 Restaurant, Inaka is 100\% Bacolod-born! My sashimi and the Makis. Their Mango Juice is the best counterpoint after a hearty Japanese mea!! Through these years, some of the waiters that have served us are still there!

Felicias at 6th and Lacson Street. They serve a wide selection of desserts but many love their ensaymada with local hot choco and the super creamy Lengua de Gato.

From Leftovers >>>


Many times, it pays to bring a Tupperware to a small party like your prayer meeting, ladies gathering, baby shower, Pot Luck Party or Class Reunion. Of course, one will not do this at a buffet or formal dinner or wedding party--- jologs naman yong magbabalot ng food while wearing a formal outfit. ## Recipe:

1 Cup of mashed potatoes (kahit may garlic flavor or other flavors.... okay pa rin) or Rice (kahit fried rice, java rice, brown or red rice... basta leftover rice!)

Broccoli at iba pang kasamang veggies or meats (just be sure to cut the broccoli and meats into small pieces, smaller than bite size)

Boil the chicken broth and add the broccoli group. - Add in the mashed potatoes or the rice right away. Bring to a boil.
Add the milk or sour cream

For the two-day conference, expanded programs and hands-on demonstrations were also held with speakers from around the globe.


After hearing of her inspiring talk delivered during the International Maritime Organization (IMO) conference, together with Marina and Women in Maritime, the organizers were happy to learn about the modernization efforts of FastCat. Pastrana was then invited by the organizers to talk about more of their plans and strategies.

It was a great opportunity for Pastrana to share FastCat's plans for development with regards to fleet modernization, and crew training. She presented to the international audience of maritime experts why Filipino seafarers are the best in the industry.
